Health & Safety Policy

1.0 Definition

Urbis Consulting recognise and acknowledge our responsibilities under the Health & Safety at Work etc Act 1974 and other relevant statutory provisions to minimise risks to the health, safety and welfare of staff, members of the public and others who might be affected by our activities.

2.0 Policy Statement
